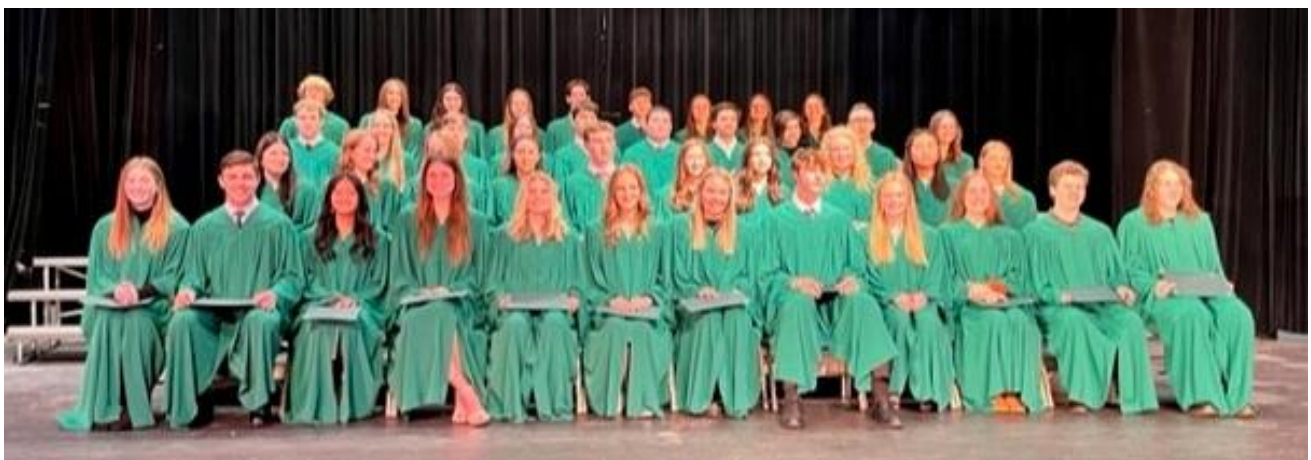
WDMB - 2022 NJ STATE GRAND CHAMPIONS!!!

ILLNESS REMINDERS FROM THE DISTRICT NURSES

In regards to illness, please keep in mind the 24-hour rule. If your child suffers from fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or any other contagious illness, it is the school district policy that he/she remains out of school for at least 24 hours after the symptoms have cleared up. If we all work together, your child can have a very healthy classroom. If you are not sure if your child is well enough to attend school, ask yourself if you would want a child with the same symptoms sitting next to your son or daughter. If the answer is no, then it is best to keep your child home for the day.

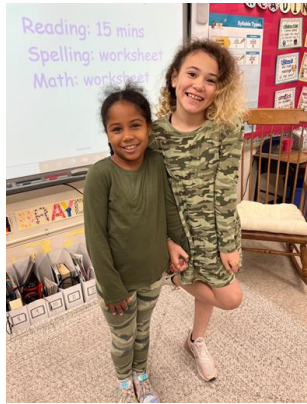
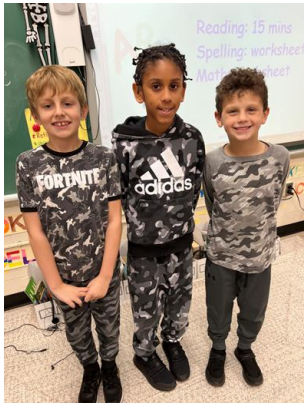
When your child becomes ill or injured at school, the health office will attempt to contact the telephone numbers listed on the emergency information you completed at the beginning of the school year. It is critical that the school have current emergency contact numbers. If your home, work, or cell phone number(s) change during the school year, please call the school immediately to update them. We will always attempt to contact parents first unless we have been instructed otherwise. Only those individuals listed on the emergency contacts are allowed to pick up students. If alternate arrangements need to be made, you must inform the school who will be assuming responsibility for your child.

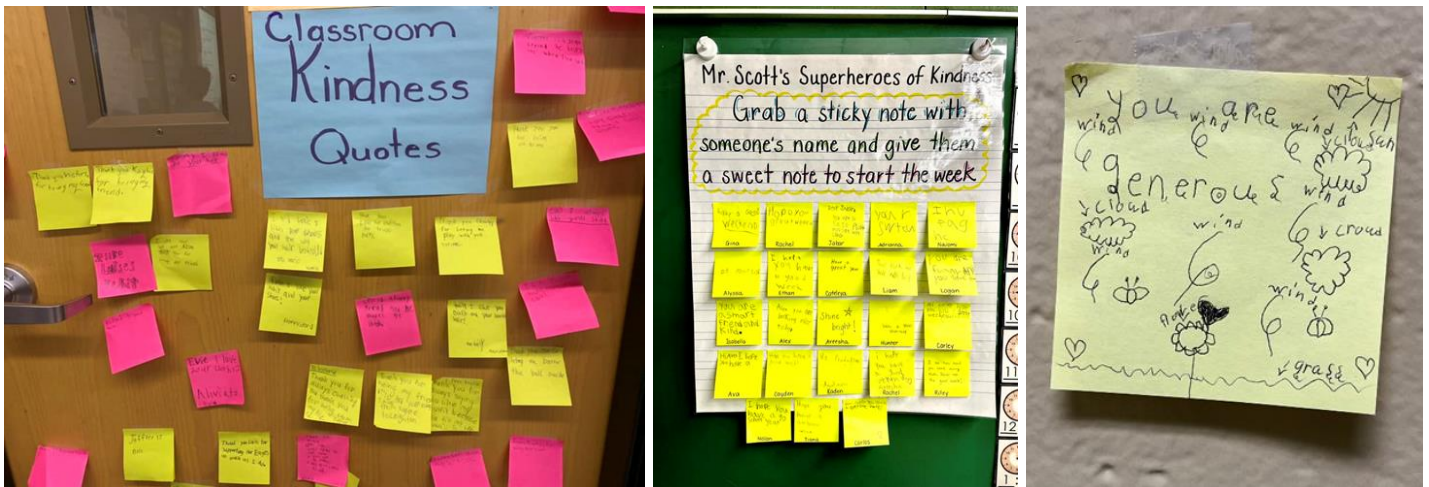


Red Bank Students participated in school-wide counseling lessons based on the book, *Kindness Grows*, by Britta Teckentrup. They created a Red Bank Family Kindness Tree, using handprints instead of leaves for their tree,

which promotes a sense of belonging and connection between all students between grade levels and for the students to understand they have the power to be kind no matter what their circumstance.
