21st Century Scholars are at it again this summer using their thinking and problem solving skills to complete challenges and tasks with a focus on academics. This summer there were eight mornings of programming available in the Green-Fields library for children who just finished kindergarten through fourth-grade.

Our youngest participants spent three days completing "Superhero Training Camp." Did you know superheroes are good at math, science, and language arts? Our trainees took on villains and showcased their skills with relays, STEM activities, and creative thinking.

One of my favorite games to play with students in firstand second-grade is called Superhero Hotline. I create a scenario and then begin to randomly select students to answer the "phone" and help me brainstorm an answer. This year Savannah Baldwin, Luca Scirotto, and Edith Johns were especially quick on their feet to solve some sticky situations with buses and bees. They used their quick thinking skills and knowledge of science to imagine helpful superpowers and creative solutions.



On our final day of training, we asked our participants to use a Venn Diagram to compare real world heroes with superheroes. During this activity we worked together to identify some problems heroes could solve. Our heroes agreed that taking care of animals and the earth are our top priorities. One insightful first-grader, Dominic Citrone, used his knowledge of real world problems to suggest heroes can work together to cure viruses before they shut down our world in the future.

Other workshops and camps this summer included Knowledge Bowl Training, Using Games to Learn, and Collaboration Challenges that kept our third- and fourth-grade attendees working together while utilizing their academic skills. These programs are designed to meet the needs of students who love learning in a classroom so much that waiting until September to return was unfathomable. ### SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM


A wide variety of special education programs are available for students between the ages of 3 and 21 who require specialized instruction and/or related services such as speech/language services, occupational therapy, and physical therapy in order to meet their educational needs. Educational program options include: instruction in a general education class with all the necessary and appropriate supports, supplemental instruction, resource center programs, special class programs within the school district, special education programs in out-of-district public or private schools, individual instruction at home, in medical institutions or other appropriate facilities.

### PRESCHOOL DISABLED PROGRAM

The Preschool Disabled Program provides appropriate educational experiences for youngsters between the ages of 3 and 5 who experience developmental delays in the areas of speech and language, motor development, cognition, and/or social/emotional functioning. The school district offers an educational program, related services, and curb-to-curb transportation at no cost to parents. The children are placed according to individual needs and developmental levels. In the preschool programs, they are encouraged to explore new materials, develop emerging skills, and interact in a social setting. Speech/language therapy and occupational therapy are offered as an integral part of the classroom program and/or on an individual basis as needed.

If warranted, other services such as physical therapy may be initiated.

The West Deptford Young Eagles Program is a fully licensed Child Care Center located at all three elementary schools. During the 2023-2024 school year, we will be offering care to West Deptford residents in kindergarten thru sixth grade. Children will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities, including arts and crafts, games, homework time, and indoor/outdoor play. Breakfast and snack are provided daily. Program options and hours of operation are listed below.

AM Sessions: 6:45 AM to start of the school day. PM Sessions: School dismissal to 6:30 PM

Drop-In Voucher Program:

- PM Drop-In Care Booklet \$100.00 (5 Vouchers/5 Sessions)
- PM Drop-In Care on Half Days will require two PM Drop-In Care Vouchers to be turned in.

### NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION



A person, other than the parent, who intends to enroll a student WITHOUT proof of custody or guardianship, CANNOT enroll a student unless a legal guardianship, issued by the state or by the court of law, is submitted.

Presenting a false record or falsifying records is an offense under Section 37.10, Penal Code and enrollment of the child under false documents, subjects the person to liability for tuition and other costs. TEC Sec.25.002 (3)(d).

- Step 1: Student ONLINE PRE-REGISTRATION must be completed prior to submitting documents. To start the process, go to <a href="https://www.wdeptford.k12.nj.us">www.wdeptford.k12.nj.us</a> or <a href="https://www.wdschools.org">www.wdschools.org</a>.
- Step 2: In 2 business days after submitting the Pre-Registration, you will get an email "Notice of Incomplete Registration" that has a list of required documents to be submitted to complete the registration.

The "Notice of Incomplete Registration" email will also have a **link/instructions** for you to schedule an appointment to submit the documents.

Documents that MUST be submitted_IN-PERSON [by the parent/legal guardian]
□ BIRTH CERTIFICATE of the student, must be original with the raised seal (hospital certificate NOT acceptable
□ PHOTO ID/DRIVERS LICENSE (government-issued) of the parent or legal guardian
Documents that can be submitted IN-PERSON or can be UPLOADED during pre-registration only
□ CUSTODY/GUARDIANSHIP issued by the court of law or by the state, if applicable
□ <b>DEED, PROPERTY TAX</b> or <b>MORTGAGE</b> bill ( <b>recent</b> ; must submit one) for <u>PROPERTY OWNERS</u> - OR -
<b>LEASE CONTRACT</b> for <u>RENTERS</u> with a <u>current lease date</u> (If lease has an expired date, you must submit
proof of lease renewal)
☐ <b>UTILITY</b> bill ( <b>recent</b> water & sewer or gas or electric/solar bill; must submit one)
☐ For *SHARED-HOUSING, notarized RESIDENCY AFFIDAVITS (blank forms available online or in our office)
☐ IMMUNIZATION record (up-to-date)
□ PHYSICAL EXAMINATION record (must be taken within 1 year from date of last physical)
□ TRANSFER CARD (required, if transferring within NJ; parent MUST REQUEST a copy from school)
□ REPORT CARD or unofficial TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS (required for incoming 9th - 12th grades)
IEP/504 PLAN/SPEECH if applicable

\*SHARED-HOUSING - Parent/Guardian's name is NOT on the PRIMARY Proof of Residency

If you are residing with a family or a friend in West Deptford, the resident who owns or renting the property, must provide proof that you reside in West Deptford with a notarized RESIDENCY AFFIDAVIT and two (2) Proofs of Residency as listed above. Person on the affidavit and on the Deed/Property Tax/Mortgage bill or Lease plus Utility bill must be the same person.
