20 minutes

- Explore topic through text or primary source images
- Summarize independent or partner work to identify the main concepts of the lesson

ASSESS AND DIFFERENTIATE

10 minutes

- Intervention teacher-led
- On-Level and Advanced independent
- Summarize Quick Check to assess all students' understanding
